## Capone, in G-Men Custody, Quakes as 'Freedom' Nears

LOS ANGELES—(AP)—Alfonse (Scarface Al) Capone, brewer of some of the vilest concoctions that ever seared the innards of prohibition era drinkers, was in jowling fear for his life today on the eve of his release from Federal custody.

The Federal government also was worried. It made of his leave-taking from prison a mystery it hoped could not be solved by the trigger men, whom Capone swore were waiting to "rub him out" with erasers of lead.

G-men were in charge of him somewhere in the United States. That was all the Department of Justice would say. He was scheduled to be released next Sunday, nor will the Federal agents where they'll do the still may be in the prison, in Los Angeles where he served months of his term in the castle in Miami Beach. He may be in a hotel of a dozen cities.

If he has left the prison, it wouldn't seem to be a chance of anyone running him on the street.

Partly paralyzed from crinkly-skinned from loss of weight, totally bald and sometimes talking gibberish, Capone is a human caricature of Public Enemy No. 1, the man who took care of competition with machine guns.

Scarface Al went to prison—Atlanta, then Alcatraz—and he got time off for good behavior. Prohibition was repealed, and his lawyers spent their time digging up his fine. They paid it in installments, last of which they handed over only a few days ago. Capone still is reputed to be a millionaire several times over.

## U. S. Agents Keep Capone Vigil

BALTIMORE—(AP)—Broken, flabby and ailing "Scarface" Al Capone stared vacantly at the ceiling of a \$30 a day hospital suite today, free of prison cells in which he lived for seven years but sentenced now to a lingering brain disease.

Outside the one-time Chicago gang czar's room sat a male orderly and a nurse. In or near the hospital were three Federal agents, assigned by Attorney General Murphy to keep the fallen vice emperor under surveillance because, Murphy said, "certain things have come to our attention."

Whether the agents were to guard someone from himself or from posing a gangland reprisal was not clear. No uniformed police assigned to Union Memorial and officials asserted none unless requested by the chief came here today from the Federal penitentiary in Lehigh, Pa., and general hospital as the Joseph E. Moore, of the syphilis division Hopkins medical center, suffering from paresis—the brain—but it was while his condition is in no immediate danger.
